RECYCLE TODAY for a Better Tomorrow

Lach year, up to ten million tons of plastic are dumped into our oceans, according to UNESCO. It works out to about two thousand trash trucks full every day! Now microplastic particles are making their way into our food and water supplies. That's why Montereau residents Dave and Cindy Bagwell are inspired to make a difference. Since arriving here in 2024, they have been working to raise awareness in our community.

Dave is eager to educate people about the process. He explains that items bearing the numbers 1, 2, or 5 in the middle of the recycling triangle on the bottom are recyclable. He reminds us to rinse or wipe away food from a container before dropping it into a recycling bin. Dave also suggests keeping a paper bag under the sink for collecting recyclables and for ease of disposal. He says, "If I can get other people, even just a few, to do something they weren't doing before, I feel like I've helped."





Recycling at Montereau is pretty simple. In the Towers, there is a yellow cart in each first-floor refuse room for plastics, paper, and cardboard.

Garden Home residents may take recyclables to the yellow bins at the back dock on the east side of the main building.

Dave is excited to see more people participating in general recycling, but says his real passion is glass. "It's called 'infinitely recyclable,' because it can be used over and over again," he explains. There are now additional containers for glass in the refuse rooms near apartments 107, 114, 136, and 145 with plans for two more.

Dave says they're recycling between 100 and 300 glass items, mostly wine bottles, each week. Volunteers help collect and take them to the glass recycling spot at LaFortune Park. If you'd like to get involved, contact Dave at 830-446-1581 or bagwelld6@gmail.com.

W ith an eye for detail and whimsy and a mind bursting with creative flourish, Diane Holcomb is a writer at heart. "Everything is a metaphor to me." She delights in small simplicities and finds

beauty and elegance in things others might overlook.

Diane was born in Shawnee, Oklahoma but moved to Houston at the age of two. The eldest of four, she was "big sister" to two brothers and one sister. She says she has always been shy in public. At home, though, she laughs, "I thought I was in charge!" When she was about 13, they moved to Spring Branch, Texas, where she completed high school. Always one for creative expression, Diane joined the school choir in the fourth grade and continued singing through her senior year. She still has copies of albums her high school choir recorded.

During high school, she volunteered at the local hospital and then worked as a nurse's aid. It wasn't enough to spark an interest in the medical field however. "I just can't stand to watch people who are hurt," she says. After graduation in 1963, she was off to Texas Christian University to study business at the urging of her father. She says the experience helped her get over some of her shyness. She was an Alpha Delta Pi. But two semesters in, Diane realized business wasn't the right fit.

In '64, she wrapped up the year at TCU and joined her family in moving to Tulsa, taking a secretarial position at Dresser Engineering. She continued working while returning to college for another year, this time at TU. Soon, though, she decided she was learning more from life experience than the classroom. Back at Dresser, she met the love of her life. Allan Holcomb, a draftsman at the company, caught her eye and her heart. "He was so handsome as he would walk across the room," Diane says wistfully. She says she initiated their first date, a Johnny Mathis concert in town. They dated for two years before eloping in 1966.

She continued working after they wed, at Cities Service oil company and Douglas Aircraft. The young couple moved to rural Sperry, Allan's hometown.In 1970 they welcomed their firstborn, James, followed soon after by Laurie. Diane lights up with pride in her family which also includes Allan's daughter Terry from a previous marriage, one grandson and a greatgranddaughter.

When the children started school, Diane returned to the classroom. This time, it was on her terms. She enrolled at Tulsa Junior College, now TCC, to learn to be a better poet and writer. She'd found her groove. "It was so nice," she says with satisfaction. "You don't have to take the stuff you don't like, and that's so much fun!" She took classes on poetry, screenwriting, even how to write a novel. Diane became guite prolific, writing poetry, a one-act play called "Stella's Web," and trying her hand at the novel. "My goal was to write a funny novel, but it's not as easy as it sounds," she explains. She has since published a book of her poetry called "Window Peeping and Other Poems." Diane joined numerous poetry clubs, attended and spoke at seminars, and won countless literary contests. Here at Montereau, she is a faithful member of the Poetry Appreciation Group.

After a short real estate career, Diane and Allan embarked on a new adventure in the late '80s, purchasing a thoroughbred racehorse named Forliran. It was an exciting time shortly after Remington Park opened. They traveled to racetracks around the country for three years before selling Forliran.

Diane volunteered her time with community organizations and remained involved when she and Allan came to Montereau in 2013 as his Alzheimer's progressed. She lost him in 2015 after 49 years of marriage, but is thankful for the care he had in the Abbey just a short walk away from her apartment.

With her penchant for whimsical things, Diane has several distinct collections that include unusual rocks, Hummel figurines, and decorative bookmarks just right for her large book collection. She is a fan of the Outlander book series and has met its author. Always ready for the next adventure, Diane reads every night before going to sleep.



She may be soft-spoken, but Diane has plenty to say. Whether it's in the written word, or friendly conversation, you'll be all the better for listening.
